Easter Joy

On Tuesday, March 12th, our Bishop met with our church council as well as the council of Christ Lutheran Church to help facilitate a conversation about our ministries and mission in San Clemente. It was a wonderful time to reflect on the great work each church is already doing, ways in which each of our churches can continue to grow and possible ways to support one another in that growth. This month, in the midst of the Easter season, I wanted to take the opportunity to share some of the major takeaways from that meeting.

The Easter season (Eastertide) is a time each year where we focus on joy. The joy of Jesus' defeat of death, the joy of the resurrected Jesus and the joy of our own participation in Jesus' resurrected life. This is difficult, joy is difficult, when things are not perfect or as we would like them to be. I believe that is true today. Things are not perfect. Like all churches, we would love more money, more people and we may even be tempted to think there might not be a tomorrow, that God might be done using Our Savior's. God is not done with us. The aforementioned meeting reminded me of that because in dreaming and conversation, I started to better understand some of the many possible futures God might have in store for us.

Each congregation of the ELCA is wholly independent in their self-governance and decision making but that does not mean we are alone. Our synod and our bishop does not have any power to make decisions on our behalf or tell us what to do but they can help when we let them. The bishop did exactly this when he met with us. After conversations with Pastor Juli, Bishop Dave and myself, we decided that getting our councils together would be helpful. The challenges facing Our Savior's are the same challenges facing Christ Lutheran (and the Synod as a whole) and that means we are not alone and do not have to solve them in isolation. In conversation together, we started to think more collaboratively and reflect on what we have been doing, what has worked and what we might need to change.

At one point, the bishop asked the gathered group what we thought some of the spiritual needs were in San Clemente. One of the things that got named was the need for community, the spiritual need for belonging and company with others. We spoke about the nationwide problem of isolation and loneliness, especially coming out of the pandemic. This was one place where we started to consider how we could better support one another's churches. What if we spent time in fun and fellowship with one another?

In hindsight, this seems so simple but looking ahead I believe this is a great thing to try and will in time be a great source of joy. Actually, this is something we have already being doing and trying with our youth. Our youth group has gotten together with other South Orange County ELCA churches for occasional fun and fellowship with great success. This works so well because, in part, more bodies means more things are possible- games, conversations, community service.

While the meeting was little more than a preliminary exercise in dreaming and discernment, it was a source of hope and joy for myself and those gathered around that table. In this Easter season, I hope this brief snippet of the conversation can be a source of joy for you as well!

If you watch the news these days, it seems like the teens in our society are completely out of control. We see dangerous street takeovers, teens violently mobbing shopping malls, looting and stealing from them, fighting in the bathrooms at school, heck, even fighting with Marines on the beach! It seems insane.

Now, I am not naïve to the fact that these things happen, and I am in no way condoning any of this violent and dangerous behavior, but there is more to the situation. You see I spend a great amount of time with young people, and I can tell you firsthand that besides the normal middle/high school hijinks that come with adolescence, most of the teens around us are honest, caring young people. Case in point, James Simons, if you don't know James, you should, James attended Our Savior's Lutheran School during his pre and elementary school years and now is a student at San Clemente High School. James also serves on our church council as the Youth and Family Ministry representative and is doing a fantastic job. For example, just this past weekend we had a campus cleanup event to get the church prepared for Holy Week. James spoke with the AVID group from his school and arranged to have 10 (or so) students come and help with the dirty jobs of campus cleanup. I can tell you that these teens did a fantastic job, in the rain, and never complained or tried to get out of any job they were asked to do. In much the same way, on Palm Sunday (the next day) the youth ministry held it's annual Pancake Breakfast and as expected, there was James and several of our high, middle, and elementary students in the kitchen and on the patio making breakfast and sharing a laugh as they worked together to serve the church.

It is my pleasure to work alongside these young folks and our wonderful adult volunteers as they develop their sense of place, identity, and faith.

So don't let the news steal your joy, there are many good, honest, and decent teens all around us, often they can be found with me up in the choir loft/tech space during Sunday worship, either worshipping or helping with worship tech.

There will be a wine tasting on Thursday night, April 4th in the church sanctuary ("Le Bistro") to enjoy Rosé from Provence and elsewhere in France and California. Judy discovered Rosé in Aix in Provence in 2017 and it's been a favorite of hers ever since. The



lighter the pink/peach color, the better for her, as it's dryer and not too sweet or fruit forward in her estimation. We'll be bringing two wines she likes that are well under \$10 a bottle--La Vieille Ferme (available at Ralph's) and La Ferme Julien (at Trader Joe's). Rosé is a sipping wine and wonderfully pairable with fish, fruit and salads. Also great to sip on your terrace or patio at sunset or on a lazy summer afternoon.

If you would like to join us, please bring one bottle of Rosé per couple and wine glasses. We look forward to tasting all the wines you bring. Rosé wines are available almost everywhere now, with most being under \$20, including sparkling. There are lots of wonderful California Rosé wines from up and down the coast and inland. SOCIAL CONCERNS

Thank you everyone that contributed to our social concerns efforts during the month of March. Whether it was a contribution of laundry bottles or egg crates; money for Lutheran Retreats, Camps and Conferences, or money for World Hunger, you have helped people inside and outside our local community.

During the meeting with the Bishop and Christ Lutheran Council Members, we explored ways that we might collaborate, rather than duplicate or compete. We also talked about the needs of the San Clemente community and the conversation touched on those less fortunate. One thing that touched me was the continued effort that Christ Lutheran does with Laundry Love. On the third Wednesday of each month from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., volunteers meet at Laundry Basket South in San Clemente, 2399 S El Camino Real, San Clemente, CA 92672 (just across from Jack in the Box) with rolls of guarters and detergent sheets to help folks do laundry.

Our Savior's is going to work collaboratively with Christ Lutheran in supporting the Laundry Love program. First, if you would like to volunteer on the third Wednesday of the month from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m., you can contact Christ Lutheran's church office at 949-496-2621 or email secretary@clcsanclemente.org. I have it on good authority that if you show up to volunteer, you won't be turned away. A second way we are going to support this ministry is for the month of April we will have a Laundry Love jar where you can put your loose change or even perhaps a donation of a roll of quarters. We will periodically give the collected funds to Christ Lutheran for the effort. (P.S. We would also like to provide hygiene kits to FAM for their

reopening. We are looking for a Thrivent member to sponsor an Action Team that would provide "seed money" to buy the supplies for the kits. If you are willing to do this, please contact me, so we can get it going. It was fun to see folks packaging the kits during our Stewardship campaign. If this touches your heart and you would like to contribute funds, you can designate your donation as Hygiene Kits.

Christ Lutheran will be joining in this effort to restock FAM's shelves. Let's show San Clemente how loving and caring Lutheran's are.
