## Second Christmas

The calendar year is over but the Christmas season continues. The twelve days of Christmas are not the 12 days leading up to Christmas but rather the 12 days from Christmas Day to the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6th). In some cultures and at times throughout history, the feast day of the Epiphany has been celebrated as a second Christmas.

The Epiphany recounts the visit of the magi to the infant Jesus and, therefore, the beginning of Jesus' being revealed to the Gentiles (non-Jewish people). It makes sense that since this story recounts the giving of gifts, many people have chosen this day, and not Christmas or Christmas Eve, to exchange gifts with one another.

As a season, Epiphany is what bridges the time between Christmas and Lent- between birth and the journey towards death. This year, during the season of Epiphany I will be preaching on different call stories. We will begin with the baptism of Jesus (and all of our baptismal callings as followers of Jesus) and then through the calls of various characters from Scripture. You can look further in the newsletter for the schedule of who we will talk about each week and the passages I will be preaching on if you want to read ahead before Sunday.

My reason for doing this is twofold- to spend more time focusing on God-given gifts and to hopefully make clear that no person or peoples from the Bible were perfect, they were just like us. In baptism, we are all called to be followers of Jesus and utilize our unique gifts for the sake of the word (this is what vocation is). Some people, like myself, are called into professional ministry. Most people, however, are called into all sorts of other professions or roles- parenthood, business, working with the land, making art, building things, etc. Looking at a few different people from Scripture we will also see a unique set of vocations that imperfect people just like you and I were called into.

I hope that during the remainder of this Christmas season and as we begin the season of Epiphany you are refreshed and inspired by the example of what God has done for us and what the generations before us have done for the world in following their callings. I wish you well as we enter into a second Christmas and beyond.


Our Confirmation classes are off to a good start, and we look forward to the spring when we get to support our confirmands as they claim their faith as their own!

#### Lutherans and Liturgy

Whether new to the Lutheran Church or a life-long Lutheran, it is sometimes good to review why we do what we do. Our Savior's and the Lutheran Church is a <u>liturgical church</u> and follows the <u>liturgical calendar</u>. So, what does that mean??? Let's look at the definition of liturgy:

Liturgy - "the work of the people" i.e., what people do together (in worship).

Often you will also hear the term rite used relative to and its definition from Websters is:

Rite -- "a body of customary observances characteristic of a Church or a part of it"

Bottom line our worship has a certain predictability to it.

Sundays and Seasons is one of our primary resources for worship planning, describes it this way.

In the principal service of Christian worship, the Holy Spirit gathers people around the means of grace—the saving Word of God and the sacraments. From the table of communion where Jesus Christ comes with forgiveness, life, and salvation, God sends us out to share the good news and to care for those in need.

Martin Luther said about public worship: "at home, in my own house, there is no warmth or vigor in me, but in the church when the multitude is gathered together, a fire is kindled in my heart, and it breaks its way through."

Recall the words of Matthew 18:20 - For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them."

One of Martin Luther's reforms of the catholic traditions of the day was to incorporate congregational singing into the corporate (public) worship. So why sing? In Colossians 3:16

<sup>16</sup> Let the message of Christ dwell among you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom <u>through psalms</u>, <u>hymns</u>, <u>and songs from the Spirit</u>, <u>singing to God with gratitude in your hearts</u>.

#### And in Ephesians 5:10 and 20

Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, <sup>20</sup> always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Singing engages distinct parts of our vocal chords and distinct parts of our brain. Some say that singing engages our emotions more than just speaking. Most recently, while not in a worship service, but in our handbell concert, I was moved to tears when I heard the audience singing Silent Night. The "choir" members were in the audience and were singing harmony. This would not have happened if I were just singing for myself, or simply reading the words of Silent Night. It was very moving. Luckily, I had an easy part to ring, so my tears did not mess up my ringing. Even if you are not comfortable with your singing, your singing may touch someone else.

There are the inevitable comments 1) I can't sing and 2) I don't do that type of music. To the first point, Psalm 100 says make a joyful noise not a perfect pitched soprano voice. In bell choirs, we often tell the ringers that God hears what is in our hearts, not necessarily the missed notes we play. To the second point, when we try new things, we engage our brains and hearts. Try and find God's word and power in that song you don't know or don't like the music.

I admit I am one of those people that initially rejected most contemporary church music. "all" contemporary songs were junk theology, etc. But as I have been involved in the worship planning with Pastor Cole and George, I have found that the contemporary music have some really good theology. So even if you find it difficult to sing, try and look at the words and see God's love, and truth. And the converse is true, if you find the traditional hymns less of your style, look to the words and see God's love and truth AND engage your voice to allow God to work in you.

The council is collaborating with Pastor Tom at the synod on some things and recently he said something that stuck with me. Pastor Tom indicated that we need to pour ourselves out when we come to worship and let God work within us.

Next month we will look a bit at the liturgical calendar and liturgical colors.



#### VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE OFFERED AT OUR SAVIOR'S FOR 2024 TAX SEASON

Our Savior's is partnering with United Way Orange County to provide Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) to those that make less than \$64,000 a year. Tax preparation services for those that qualify will be provided at Our Savior's on Fridays and Saturdays 9:00am - 2:00pm beginning the first week in February to early April. We will be using the office building for the effort.

This came about because FAM, whom we partner with often, is unable to provide the services this year. Sharon Guilliams collaborated with the Council and Pastor to see if Our Saviors could help out because of the impact on our local community that she has seen. In years past, VITA in San Clemente has prepared about two hundred tax returns per year for local households, at no cost to the clients.

Volunteers man the program. There are opportunities for volunteers to help with greeting clients, interpreting for clients, and preparing the tax returns. (Note you do not have to be a CPA or accountant to prepare returns.) Training is provided for all volunteers. If you could offer your time and/or talent for this effort it would be appreciated or if you know someone that might be willing to help. (Could be a terrific way to introduce someone to Our Savior's.)


